- The Community Baboon Sanctuary: This is a pioneered project in voluntary grassroots conservation by the local Creole villagers. See the Black Howler Monkey (known as the "Baboon" locally) in their natural rainforest setting protected in a sustainable environment. An American primatologist, Dr. Robert Horwich, along with a local landowner named Fallet Young, founded the sanctuary. The sanctuary was founded in 1985 by Dr Robert Horwich, an American primatologist, and community landowner Fallet Young. Since then it has grown to what it is today and now helps to ensure the protection of not only the Black Howler, but various other species.
- **Do you love animals?** Are you passionate about protecting them and their habitat? Join us and visit the Community Baboon Sanctuary (CBS) Experience filled with Belize's rich cultural heritage and incredible wildlife.

• Visit Bermuda Landing Village: Take a first-hand visit to the local Creole community in Bermuda Landing and be inspired by the success story of this community that came together to protect the native Black Howler Monkeys.

This is an experience for all nature lovers! Experience a fantastic and exhilarating boat ride along the city's scenic coast en route to the historic Belize River for a true wild experience with your knowledgeable tour guide. Your will first stop is a manatee watch, Belize is home to the West Indian Manatees (Trichechus manatus). Belize is the stronghold for this endangered subspecies, with a population estimated at between 800 to 1,000. Your tour guide will later be pointing an array of native birds, crocodiles and iguana sun bathing along the river banks, and sometimes even some playful dolphin in the area. Learn of the historic use of the river by the Mayan and the Logwood cutters of past times and of the flora and funa on this adventure. On the return relax and enjoy the scenic boat ride with a refreshing beverage. Wildlife sighting guaranteed

- **Airboat Ride on Alomond Hill Lagoon**: Enjoy an adventureous 30min Airboat nature ride though rich mangorve lagoon.
- Live Garifuna Cultural Music Live Garifuna drumming and dancing. The Garifuna ethnic group is of African and Amerindian descent originating from fugitive slaves who were welcomed into local communities. The music and dance is a unique tradition, with drummers and dancer merging in a single performance where each single step has a precise meaning. In 2001, UNESCO (the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) declared the Garifuna culture a "Masterpiece of the Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity".
- Local rum sampling: Get a taste of our local Belizean Rum and fruit wine. Those who are interested can choose purchase from a selection of more than twenty brands of rum a special memento from the souvenir shop.

Tour content:

Enjoy the scenery as you cruise up the New River, stopping along the way at various points of interest. Your guide will note the tropical foliage, animals and birds in the area. Your captain will expertly navigate the waterway as your guide points out the interesting highlights teeming within the lush tropical wildlife. Keep your camera ready, as you're likely to see freshwater crocodiles, howler monkeys, iguanas, and over a hundred bird species.

The river empties into a lagoon where the Mayan's Lamanai ruins will come into view. Your boat will dock at the Lamanai Welcome Centre where your exploration will. Learn the history of Lamanai and see the huge masks depicting ancient gods and warriors. Well-kept paths though the ancient jungle lead to an impressive gathering of monuments and temples. Take in the enormity of this ancient architectural find, as Howler Monkeys scramble throughout the canopies of the huge Ceiba trees fringing the structures while countless birds vocalize overhead. Your guide will take you through the impressive courts and temples, and you'll have an opportunity to climb up some 125 feet for a panoramic view that encompasses the Lamanai ruins, New River Lagoon and the Lamanai Archaeology Reserve beyond.

Along the way, learn about and explore Belize's vibrant culture and history from the comfort of your air-conditioned coach. Your guide points out various landmarks and points-of-interest, such as the Baron Bliss Lighthouse, resting-place of one of Belize's benefactors, and the Museum of Belize, a former Colonial prison built by slaves.

Visit the 3rd largest Maya temple in the country. Take a short 60 minute air-conditioned motor coach through the scenic countryside of historic Creole villages of Belize. When you arrive, enjoy the adventure of exploring the ancient history of the Maya civilization.

Altun Ha was once a thriving Maya community, full of life and energy in its time. The Altun Ha Museum on site provides a wealth of information on Maya lifestyle, temple architecture, rituals and pottery.

Your certified guide will thrill you help you explore the plazas and temples of Altun Ha and provide you with interesting facts of the Maya daily life style and cultural ceremonies. The main temple of the Masonry Altars is where the famous ten-pound jade head of the Sun God Kinich Ahau was found by archaeolgists in the tomb of a Royal Priest. The jade head is one of Belize's national treasures. Weather permitting, you may climb the stone steps of the temples and enjoy the panoramic view of the plazas and countryside. At the end of your exploration, enjoy a walk through the artesian village where you can learn about the hardwood creations and arts and craft that local villagers are selling

Tour content:

Your journey into the Maya world begins with a 2hour air-conditioned bus transfer that takes you through a scenic countryside tour of the western part of Belize. The west of Belize is considered the best of the interior, as it is the gateway to the Maya Mountains and the lush tropical rainforest of Belize. Your licensed guide highlights the mountainous landscape, culture, history and lifestyle of Belizeans as you make your way to Xunantunich, Maya for Maiden of the Rock. When you arrive, you board a historic hand-cranked ferry that takes you across the Mopan River and is the only means to access the sacred grounds of this ancient city.

Atop the tallest structure at the main temple you will enjoy a panoramic view of Belize as your guide points out Guatemala, which is within eyesight as the border with Guatemala is only 2 miles away. One of the features at this ancient Maya city is the burial chamber discovered at Xunantunich. It is considered to be one of the largest Mayan burial chambers found within the last 100 years and when discovered it had a number ceramic vessels, obsidian knives, jade pearls, animal bones and some other artifacts made of stone.

After you wander across this remarkable Maya temple, your guide will escort you on your bus transfer to your lunch stop in the thriving town of San Ignacio. Here you will enjoy a typical Belizean inspired meal. Before you leave, local arts, craft and souvenirs are available for purchase.

Your journey back to the port allows you time to relax and reminisce your full day adventure that took you back in time to the world of the Maya and the best of the western cultural highlights in Belize.
