Tour Description	<p><i>Leaving the pier, drive through the city and countryside for approximately 90 minutes towards Gyeongju. Located on the eastern coast where the morning sunlight first touches the Orient, Gyeongju was once the capital of the Shilla Kingdom and center of Korea when Shilla unified the peninsula in 676 A.D. It was designated by UNESCO as one of the world's ten most historically significant sites and is known as the 'museum without walls'.</i></p> <p><i>One of Korea's best well-known temples on the western slope of Mt. Tohamsan, Bulguksa Temple is a monument to both the skill of the Shilla architects and the depth of Buddhist faith at the time. While most of the wooden buildings have been rebuilt over the centuries, all the stone bridges, stairways and pagodas are original. In 1995, Bulguksa Temple was added to UNESCO's World Heritage List. Afterwards, the coach takes you to a local restaurant for a Korean traditional Bulgogi (Marinated beef).</i></p> <p><i>Relaxed and refreshed, continue with a visit to the Gyeongju National Museum, a place of compelling interest, preserves much of the Shilla heritage including magnificent gold crowns, pottery, Buddhist artefacts, and stone sculptures. The museum also houses the Divine Bell of King Seondeok the Great, also referred to as the legendary Emulle Bell, one of Asia's largest and most resonant bells, 19 tons of bronze standing 11 feet (3.4 metres) high.</i></p> <p><i>Arrive at Tumuli Park, a collection of royal Shilla tombs located in the middle of Gyeongju. The park contains 20 tombs, of which Chonmachong (Flying Horse Tomb) is the most famous. Its name comes from the picture of a flying horse found painted on white birch bark when the tomb was excavated in 1974, and the tomb yielded more than 10,000. Tour Description	<p>Depart the pier by coach for the 30-minute drive into Busan. The UN cemetery in Busan honors UN soldiers from 16 countries and UN aids from five countries that were killed in battle during the Korean War from 1950-1953. It is the only memorial cemetery in the world dedicated to UN soldiers. While the cemetery originally held up to 11,000 graves, most of the fallen soldiers were repatriated at the request of their families, with only 2,300 graves remaining. Some notable sites and memorials include Memorial Service Hall, Memorabilia Hall, two Turkish Monuments, Greek Monument, Australian Monument, British Commonwealth Monument and two ponds.</p> <p>Next, visit The Busan Museum which offers seven regular exhibition rooms spread over three floors in addition to the Kiln Exhibition Hall, and the Outdoor Exhibition Hall. Opened in 1978, the museum has taken on a leading role in preserving traditional culture in Busan by obtaining a wealth of relics from strong excavation efforts, generous donations, and purchases, and by meticulous research.</p> <p>Experience the local atmosphere at the harbor-side Jagalchi fish market, which stretches into downtown. As a seaport, the Busan fish market offers a variety of fresh seafood, including a large shellfish section in the middle of the market. Boats unload their catches very early each morning and sell them on the spot. The sea air and fresh fish mingle with the resonant voices of the market folk to create an unforgettable experience. After, explore Gukje Market, Busan's largest and most central market area formed by merchants descended from refugees of the Korean War. The alleyways are divided into six market districts dealing in a wide variety of goods such as silk, linen, clothing, bags, glasses, and curtains. After exploring with your guide, some free time is afforded, allowing you to browse. <b>Tour Description</b>	<p>Experience the coastal beauty of Busan and one of its most beautiful Buddhist temples during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion. Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately one-hour drive through Busan City en route to the magnificent Haedong Yonggungsa Temple, one of the visited and revered Buddhist temples in Busan. Founded in 1376 and restored in 1970, this Buddhist Temple is located atop a huge rock emerging from the ocean. This spectacular site houses several temples along the shoreline, along with dozens of statues and sculptures. The sound of the East Sea Ocean waves and melody of sutra chanting from the temple create a magical effect, and further enhance the appeal of this stunning architectural marvel.</p> <p>Then, you will proceed to Nurimaru APEC House, a high-quality international conference hall full with the natural beauty and the modern beauty as well. The APEC House is the place where APEC meeting (Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation) was held in Busan in 2005. <b>Tour Description</b>	<p>Depart the ship for a one-hour coach ride to the Haedong Yonggungsa Temple. It is located along the beautiful shorelines as most Korean temples are located in the mountains. Haedong Yonggungsa Temple is one of the three sacred places related to the Goddess of Buddha of South Korea. Its motto is at least one of your wishes will be answered here through sincere prayers. The temple was first built in 1376 by the great Buddhist teacher known as Naong during the Goryeo Dynasty. Unfortunately, the temple was destroyed by fire during the Japanese invasion of Korea. Monk Ungang of Tongdo Temple rebuilt the temple in the early 1930's. In 1970, the main sanctuary of the temple was reconstructed with careful attention to the colors traditionally used in such structures. Walking down 108 steps, get close to the water's edge with scenic views towards the main temple.</p> <p>Explore Ananti Cove Resort, a large resort town consisting of 15 unique brand shops, including restaurants, a bookstore, a coffee house, all of which are rarely seen in other places. You may buy your own morning tea at "Sant' Eustachio Il Caffè, one of the top 3 cafes in Rome. This is their only cafe opened outside of Italy. Also, there is Eternal Journey, the largest in Ananti Town and It is an instagram-worthy lifestyle bookstore (or "library") with a cafe. If you wish to stretch your legs, you may walk along the coast.</p> <p>Then, enjoy a stroll around the grounds surrounded by the lush forest and tranquil sounds of nature about a 30-minute drive outside of Haeundae. The forest has kept its natural condition unopened to the public throughout the Japanese occupation, liberation, war, and industrialization. The Ahopsan Forest in Gijang-gun, Busan, is a place that was not open to the world for 400 years. "Ahopsan" of Ahopsan Forest is a pure Korean word that means embracing the nine valleys. The forest was designated as a green belt and water source conservation area for a long time, preserving the healthy natural environment and ecosystem. Inside the Ahopsan Forest are the bamboo habitat, red pine trees, hinoki cypress trees, oak trees, and other trees. The vast forest has a magnificent feel that only visitors can understand. It has also become famous recently as the filming site from the latest hit "The King: Eternal Monarch" on Netflix.</p> <p><b>Highlights</b></p> <p>Haedong Yonggungsa Temple located by the sea. <b>Tour Description</b>	<p><i>Your journey begins with a visit to Gamcheon Cultural village, located in the Korean coastal city of Busan. Nestled into the side of a mountain, the former slum is a mishmash of pastel-colored, Lego-like houses, painted in 2009 to lure visitors up steep slopes and through its tiny alleys. Gamcheon Village, once a dilapidated neighborhood that housed refugees following the Korean War, was transformed in 2009, when the government's Ministry of Culture, Sports, and Tourism launched an initiative to turn the area into a creative community. Under the theme, "Dreaming of Busan Machu Picchu," painters and sculptors added their artistic touch to the streets, homes, and businesses of Gamcheon. Nowadays, tourists flock here to look at some of the street art in the country.</i></p> <p><i>Experience the local atmosphere at the harbor-side Jagalchi fish market, which stretches into downtown. As a seaport, the Busan fish market offers a variety of fresh seafood, including a large shellfish section in the middle of the market. Boats unload their catches very early each morning and sell them on the spot. By the time you arrive, mountains of fresh seafood will be attractively arranged on ice. The sea air and fresh fish mingle with the resonant voices of the market folk to create an unforgettable experience.</i></p> <p><i>Then head to Busan's largest and most central market area, Gukje Market. Formed by merchants descended from refugees of the Korean War, the alleyways are divided into six market districts dealing in a wide variety of goods such as silk, linen, clothing, bags, glasses, and curtains. 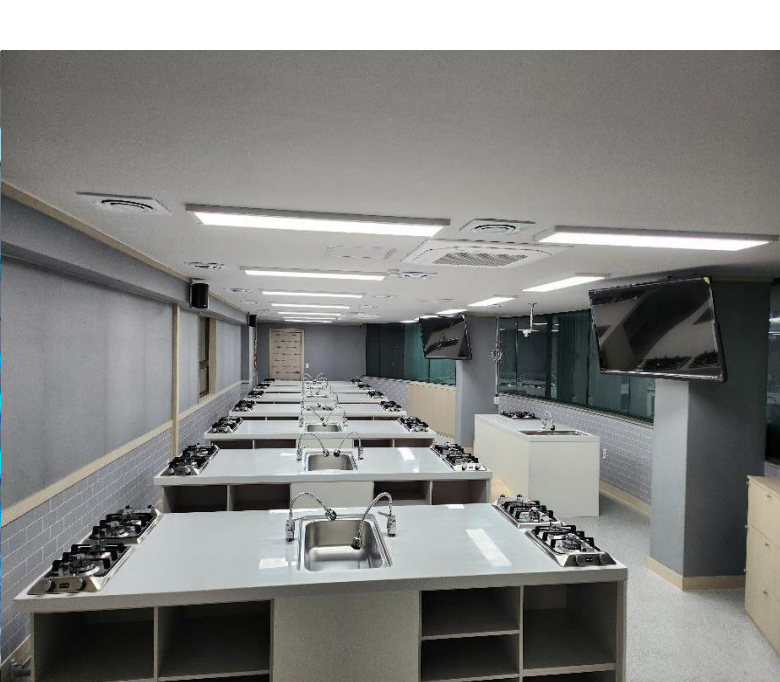

<b>Tour Description</b>	<p>Begin your journey with an experience of the local atmosphere at the harbor-side fish market, which stretches into downtown. As a seaport, the Busan fish market offers a variety of fresh seafood, including a large shellfish section in the middle of the market. Boats unload their catches very early each morning and sell them on the spot. By the time you arrive, mountains of fresh seafood will be attractively arranged on ice. The sea air and fresh fish mingle with the resonant voices of the market folk to create an unforgettable experience.</p> <p>Next, re-board your coach and proceed to the Lotte Mart at the Lotte Department Store. Some free time is made available here for shopping. Enjoy the Korean local grocery mart experience. Finally, arrive at the Cooking Institute, begin your interactive cooking lesson. <b>Tour Description</b>	<p>Located in southern part of Mt. Chiseosan, Tongdosa Temple is famous for not having any Buddhist statues in the temple. This is because the real shrines of the Buddha are preserved here. The name 'Tongdosa' was named after the belief that mankind can be saved through Buddhism. After Monk Ja-Jang brought the shrines of Buddha from Dang China, Tongdosa Temple was built during Queen Sun-Deok's reign (646). Tongdosa Temple is said to have survived numerous wars and invasions, its Beopdeung (temple candle) has never gone out, for 1,300 years. Inside, there are 35 buildings and Pagoda's, and 14 small temples in its vicinity. The main building is designated as National Treasure No.290. The temple is similar to a museum because of the numerous relics inside. There are 19 local treasures and 794 local cultural properties inside the temple. In place of the Buddha statue, the Geumgang Stairs behind of the main building preserves the shrines of the Buddha. Mt. Chiseosan, has a beautiful view from the temple. The several hundred-year-old pine trees lined up from the entrance to Ilju Gate, the small drum (used when praying in front of a Buddha figure) and bell, the sunset, the pond and the rocks and waterfalls behind the temple are grouped and called the 'Eight Famous Sceneries of Tongdosa Temple.'</p> <p>Situated on the side of a 30-meter cliff, the Oryukdo skywalk's glass floor viewing platform offers visitors a breathtaking view of Oryukdo Island. It can be found at Oryukdo Seungdumal, which is located on the southernmost point of Igidae Park's coastal walking path. The glass-floor U-shaped structure extends about 9 meters from the island, with tall reinforced glass on both sides for the safety of pedestrians.</p> <p><b>Highlights</b> Korea's largest temple, Tongdosa, "the temple without a Buddha"</p> <p><b>**Not allow standing more than 5 people in one glass plate at the skywalk due to the safety reason.</b> <b>** The guests must wear overshoes to walk on the skywalk.</b></p>

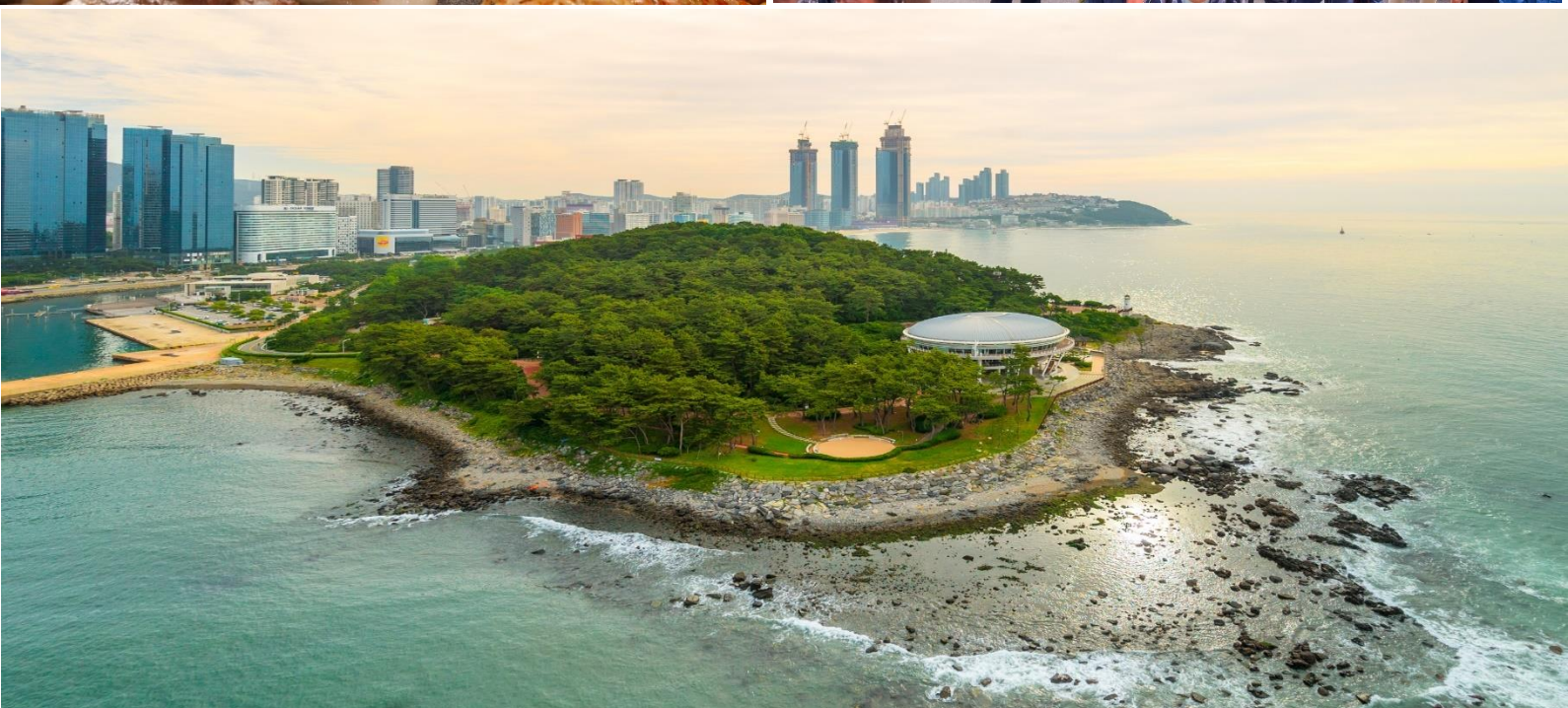

<b>Tour Description</b>	<p><i>Your first stop is Haedong Yonggungsa temple, situated near the sea unlike other temples located in mountains, therefore it's quite reasonable to call this temple an aquatic Buddhist sanctum. They say that the Great Goddess Buddha of mercy in the sea lives alone at a solitary near the sea and appears on the back of a dragon. That's why the Korean's worship of the Great Goddess Buddha was formed near the sea or on the island, and this Haedong Yonggung temple is one of three Sacred Places related to the Goddess Buddha. This temple preserves religious concept deeper than that of any other temple ever as the sea, dragon and the Great Goddess Buddha embody a harmony here.</i></p> <p><i>Then, you will proceed to Nurimaru APEC House, a high-quality international conference hall full with the natural beauty and the modern beauty as well. The APEC House is the place where APEC meeting (Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation) was held in Busan in 2005. After the APEC meeting was completed, this building and its park was re-decorated.</i></p> <p><i>After having Korean pork BBQ, you will visit to Korea's largest seafood market, Jagalchi Fish Market. After the Korean War the market solidified itself as a fish market. Most of the people who sell fish are women, so the women who sell here are called 'Jagalchi Ajumma,' 'ajumma' meaning middle-aged or married women. This market represents Busan and is famous throughout the country. If you visit you can eat fresh raw fish right at the market.</i></p> <p><i>Before returning the ship, you will visit Gukje Market, following the Korean War, refugees who fled to Busan set up stalls in order to make a living, and this was the beginning of the Gukje Market (gukje meaning "international" in Korean. The market stocks such a wide variety of goods, that you can find almost everything you need right here.</i></p> <p><b>Notes</b>  <i>** Comfortable walking shoes are recommended.  ** This excursion is not recommended for guests with mobility problems.  ** The order of the itinerary may vary.  ** You are advised to bring a sunhat, sunglasses, and bottled water.</i></p>

Beomeosa Temple is located at the eastern foot of Busan's Geumjeongsan Mountain, and was founded by the Great Priest Euisang in 678. Beomeosa Temple is one of Korea's five great Buddhist temples, boasting a wealth of cultural and historical assets, set among the scenic beauty of a wisteria-covered valley and attracting local and foreign visitors.</p> <p>Don't miss participating in a <b>Korean tea ceremony</b>, with tea prepared from tea leaves in a traditional tea set, in keeping with the Seon or meditation practiced in Buddhism. Daseon Limi is often mentioned, implying the same result from tea-drinking and practicing Seon (searching for one's true self). This meditation constitutes the core of Korean Buddhist traditions.</p> <p>Before returning the ship, you will visit <b>Gukje Market</b>, following the Korean War, refugees who fled to Busan set up stalls in order to make a living, and this was the beginning of the Gukje Market (gukje meaning "international" in Korean. The market stocks such a wide variety of goods, that you can find almost everything you need right here.</p> <p><b>Highlights</b> Learn about the Korean tea ceremony, a traditional form of tea ceremony practiced in Korea. 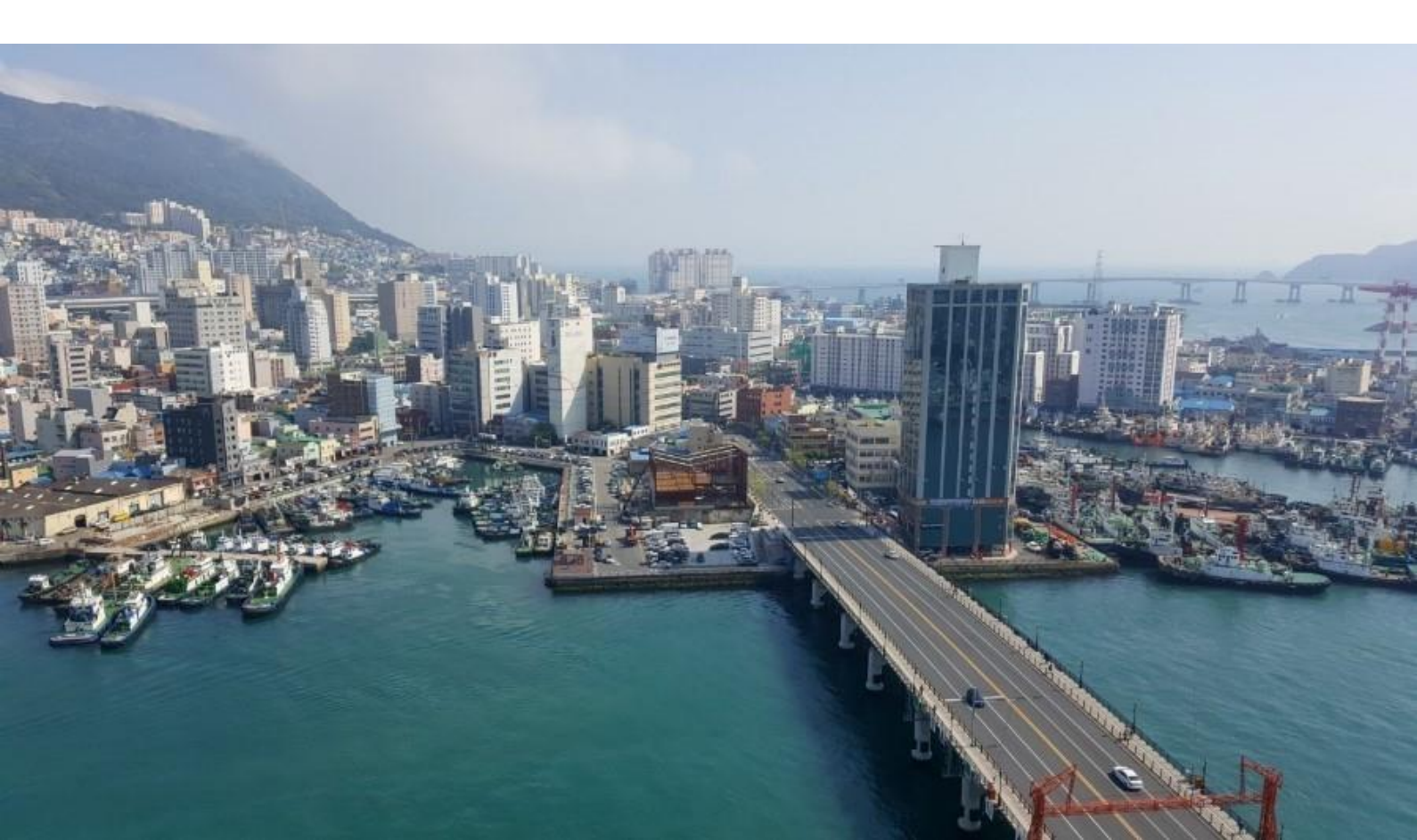

<b>Tour Description</b>	<p>You will have a great opportunity to fell Busan by walking on Youngdo. Unlike upon the mainland, Yeongdo is a district that consists only of islands. There are no metro trains that come here. There are only networks of old roads that in some parts are so convoluted as to confuse even longtime taxi drivers. It is an interesting place with a lot of stories. One legend says an old woman living in Bongnaesan Mountain protects people. Not only are there legends, but there are also inhabitants of another island. At your first stop at the observatory of Lotte Department Gwangbok Branch, you will see the beautiful scenery of Busan city and Youngdo as well.</p> <p>Next, you will cross the <b>Yeongdodaegyo Bridge</b>, connecting Jung-gu and Yeongdo-gu districts in Busan, was the first mainland-island connecting bridge in Busan. The bridge lifted to allow ships to pass between the south and north ports, rising anywhere from two to seven times in one day. When the bridge was first constructed, many people would gather to watch the strange spectacle of a bridge rising to point to the heavens, and even now, it has become a famous landmark of Busan.</p> <p>Then walk to <b>Kangkangee Arts village</b>. The area of the village was formed by the land reclamation during the Japanese colonial period. Here is the birthplace of the modern shipbuilding industry, in which “Tanaka Shipyard”, the first modern shipyard in the late 19th century, was founded. Since then, it has been widely known for shipbuilding and ship-repairing, so that people has said, “There is no ship that cannot be repaired in Daepyeong-dong.” Still, dozens of repair shipyards and nearly 200 small industrial companies and vessel parts companies occupy most of the space in the village, showing the history of the shipbuilding industry. Nowadays the elderly population aged 65 or over in Kangkangee village is 694, which is a quarter of the whole population. Due to the aging of the population, the number of an empty house has increased, and the shipbuilding industry has faced an economic recession. However, recently “Daepyeong-dong KangKangee-gil” has been attracting attention as a new tourist spot along with the restoration of Yeongdo Bridge lifting system. Also, many modern historical heritages and shipbuilding industry facilities throughout the village enable the arts-based urban regeneration projects, which has been actively carried out.</p> <p>Your last stop, <b>Huinnyeoul Culture Village</b> remains an absolute must for those heading to the island as one can explore the dramatic lives and interests of a small, simple neighborhood here. The village got its first star turn as the backdrop to the 2013 movie The Attorney. Before even that, artists around 2011 began to take residence in what had begun to turn into a decaying village. They have brought it back to life through their paintings on many walls. With their efforts, the number of visitors to Huinnyeoul Culture Village has risen considerably, despite it not being the easiest to get to destination. In addition, the village has been featured a few times on television, which has further increased its popularity. 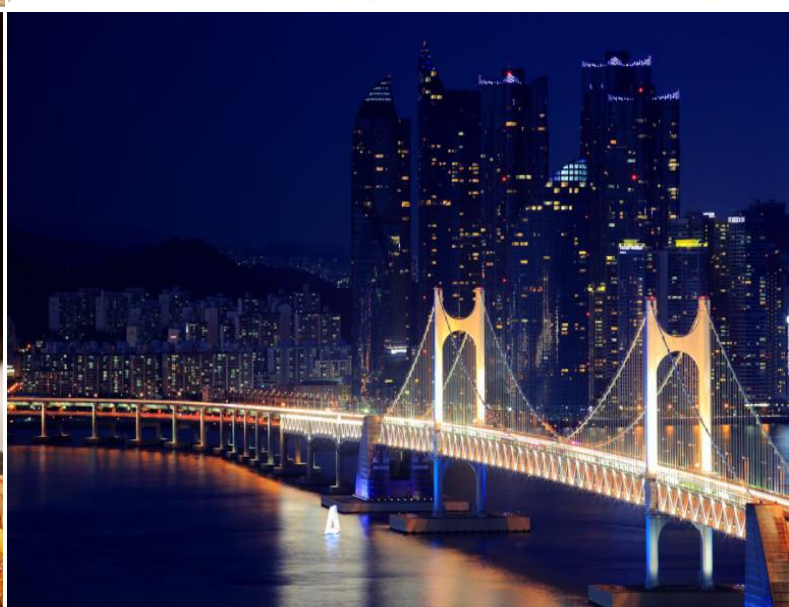
