PINNAWALA ELEPHANT ORPHANAGE - Off the Colombo - Kandy road is Pinnawela, where an orphanage was started in 1975 to house the abandoned and the wounded elephants. The number of elephants has increased to more than 65 now; including Baby Elephants brought from various parts, as well as some of the more than 25 babies born, as a result of the captive breeding programme. The best time to visit is the feeding times and the bathing times when all the elephants are taken to the river close by.

Colombo, the capital and largest city of Sri Lanka, is also the commercial capital. Colombo, located on the island's west coast, is the administrative capital of Sri Lanka. It has a mix of colonial and modern buildings.

Colombo, with its large harbor and strategic location, has been a seaport since more than 2000 years. It was only made the capital of Sri Lanka in 1815 when Sri Lanka was ceded over to the British Empire.

When the country became independent in 1948, it retained its status as capital. Colombo remained Sri Lanka's capital commercially even though administrative functions were transferred to Kotte in 1978.

Sri Lanka is a strategic maritime link between West Asia, and Southeast Asia. It was an important Allied base in World War II. After several decades of stability and economic growth, the nation was granted independence in 1948. However, it fell into civil war and saw its prosperity eroded by violent violence

Kandy Day Tour (Temple of Tooth Relic & Peradeniya Royal Botanical Garden)

Kandy is one of the most important tourism sign city in Sri Lanka. Today your tour guide/ representative will bring you to Kandy city. Then you will enjoy with some refreshments and commence your city tour, including Kandy city, Temple of Tooth Relic and Peradeniya Royal Botanical Garden.



Kandy is a major city of Sri Lanka, located in the Central Province. It was the capital of the ancient kings of Sri Lanka. It is located in the Kandy plateau's hills, where you can see a large area of tea plantations. Kandy serves as the capital of Central Province and is an administrative and religious center. Kandy is home to the Temple of the Tooth Relic, Sri Dalada Maligawa, one of the most sacred places of Buddhist worship. In 1988, UNESCO declared it a world heritage site. It is also home to the Temple of the Tooth Relic (Sri Dalada Maligawa), whose history shows that local Buddhist rulers resisted British, Dutch and Portuguese colonial expansions and occupations.



Temple of Tooth Relic -The Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic, also known as Sri Dalada Maligawa is a Buddhist temple located in Kandy, Sri Lanka. It is located within the royal palace complex in Kandy's former Kingdom. This building houses the relic of Buddha's tooth. The relic is believed to have been a key part of local politics since ancient times. It is believed that the person who holds it holds the power to govern the country. Sinhalese kings held the relic in the past. Due to the temple and the associated relic, the temple of the tooth has been designated a World Heritage Site.

The two chapters of Asgiri and Malwathu have their Bhikkhus worship daily in the inner chambers of the temple. Three times daily, rituals are held: in the morning, noon, and evening. Wednesdays are devoted to symbolic bathing the relic in a herbal preparation of scented water and fragrant plants called Nanumura Mangallaya. This holy water is believed have healing properties and is given to all who are present.

Peradeniya Royal Botanical Garden

The Royal Botanic Gardens, Peradeniya can be found about 5.5km west of Kandy in Central Province of Sri Lanka. The garden was visited by over 1.2 million locals in 2016 and over 400,000 tourists from abroad. It is located near the Mahaweli River, Sri Lanka's longest river. It is well-known for its orchid collection. It contains more than 4000 species, including medicinal and tropical plants. It is also home to the "National Herbarium of Sri Lanka". It covers



147 acres (0.59km2) and is located at 460m above sea level. The garden receives 200 days of annual rainfall. It is managed by the Division of National Botanic Gardens of the Department of National Botanic Gardens.

Sigiriya & Dambulla Day Tour

One of our guide/representative will meet at the Colombo port, who will be taken you to Sigirya and Dambulla. Upon arrival at Sigiriya and climbing Sigiriya Lion Rock with your guide.



Sigiriya or Sinhagiri is an ancient rock fortress located in the northern Matale District near the town of Dambulla in the Central Province, Sri Lanka. It is a site of historical and archaeological significance that is dominated by a massive column of rock approximately 180 metres (590 ft) high.

According to the ancient Sri Lankan chronicle the Cūļavaṃsa, this area was a large forest, then after storms and landslides it became a hill and was selected by King Kashyapa (477 – 495 AD) for his new capital. He built his palace on top of this rock and decorated its sides with colorful frescoes. On a small plateau about halfway up the side of this rock he built a gateway in the form of an enormous lion. The name of this place is derived from this structure; Sīnhāgiri, the Lion Rock (an etymology similar to Sinhapura, the Sanskrit name of Singapore, the Lion City)

The capital and the royal palace were abandoned after the king's death. It was used as a Buddhist monastery until the 14th century. Sigiriya today is a UNESCO listed World Heritage Site. It is one of the best preserved examples of ancient urban planning.

Dambulla Cave Temple



Dambulla is part of the Cultural Triangle of Sri Lanka. Five caves made of living rock and decorated with sculptures and murals are the most significant heritage. Pre-Brahmi inscriptions dating back to the third century BC, and murals from the eighteenth centuries, show human activity over a long time. This site was designated a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1991. The Dambulla Project, Central Cultural Fund, was responsible for mural conservation from 1982 to 1998.

The Dambulla Project, which is the only research center for murals and headquarters for mural conservation, also maintains Sri Lanka's only mural museum. This Project is also responsible for mural conservation in the surrounding temples. It is located at Dambulla Cave Temple.

Snorkeling 02 hours ride at Bentota



Snorkeling is the practice of swimming on or through a body of water while equipped with a diving mask, a shaped breathing tube called a snorkel, and usually swimfins. In cooler waters, a wetsuit may also be worn.

Sri Lanka is surrounded by the Indian Ocean, and its seas are abundant with shallow reefs with corals and marine life. Snorkeling is a safe and easy way to explore the shallower areas around

the Island, without the use of diving equipment or extensive training. All one needs are pair of fins, a snorkel, and a face mask. It is a fun sport for all ages as one can view the spectacular underwater world at a leisurely pace. Bentota is one of the best location for snorkeling.

Bentota Madu River Safari and Kosgoda Turtle Hatchery

You will meet a Ceylon Travel Dream representative at Colombo port who will take you to Bentota, then you will start an amazing boat safari on Madu River afterward enjoy with fish therapy.



Madu Ganga, located at Balapitiya in Sri Lanka, is the second largest wetland. The river is rich in biodiversity and covers 150 acres. It also contains 14 mangroves, one of the 24 mangrove species in Sri Lanka. Madu Ganga is one of the few remaining mangrove forests. This is where you can see traditional fishing techniques and prawn farming. It also houses 300 species of plants, and approximately 250 wildlife species. This makes it an ideal place for ecologists and botanists.

Boat rides and bird-watching trips can be booked by visitors. The Madu River Safari, which takes place at Balapitiya's Madu River mouth, is accompanied by local fishermen and trained professionals. It lasts approximately 1 to 2 hours, and visitors can see large areas of the wetland. The boat travels through dense mangrove forests that provide protection for many aquatic species, as well as animal and plant species. During the boat ride, one can see wild boars, water snakes and tree snakes as well as crocodiles.

On completion you will visit the turtle's conversation center.

Kosgoda is one of very few hatcheries in the country where all five species make their nests. These are the Olive Ridleys (Leatherbacks), Green Turtles, Loggerheads, Loggerheads, Hawksbills, Loggerheads, Loggerheads, Loggerheads, and Loggerheads. Ask our staff if you can release some of these delicate creatures into the ocean during your visit. They will start flapping their arms back when the waves hit them. They then fly into their homes, and the ocean fills your heart with joy.
