HALF DAY Montevideo Bike tour Type:

For a change of pace, this is the best option: a bicycle tour around Montevideo (as well as other regions of Uruguay) accompanied by Spanish / English speaking guide.

All our Bike Tours around Montevideo are specially prepared for groups/families. We recommend this as a fun, interesting and entertaining way of getting to know the city, learn of its history and have a vivid experience of each aspect of it. Bike-tourism is a different type of guided tourism, and it allows participants to experience the city differently enjoying nature too through this outdoor activity.

Tour goes through the Port area into the Old city, Independence Square, Salvo Palace, Solís Theatre, MERCOSUR Headquarters, Rodó Park, Punta Carretas Lighthouse and Pittamiglio Castle. We will ride along the coast with the 'sea' (River Plate) to one side and stop for photo opportunities along the way. (No inside visits to the venues).

Our goal is to make of each city tour an unforgettable experience, where safety, good-fellowship, fun and acquired knowledge are the main attributes.

Notes: The order of certain sights visited during a tour may change to avoid and/or alleviate congestion at destination. It is recommended that guests wear light clothing, flat comfortable shoes, take water, sunscreen, and a hat. Bicycles, helmets, and mineral water will be provided. **Minimum age: 12 years. Requirement: Medium strength**

HALF DAY Artistic Tour

Montevideo is an eclectic mix of influences in architecture, with some amazing buildings dating back to very prosperous times. The city is also an open-air exhibition of monuments and sculptures, as well as museums displaying the wonderful work of Uruguayan artists.

Begin with a stop at the Old Montevideo city (Ciudadela) Gates in Independence Square and walk down pedestrian Sarandi Street to Constitution Square to find the best-preserved buildings from the Spanish Colonial period, including the Town Hall, the Spanish Neoclassical Cathedral, and also examples of the Italian influence in architecture such as the Uruguay Club and the sculptural water fountain of Gianni Ferrari. On the way, visit to Joaquin Torres Garcia Museum which reveals the work of Uruguay's most influential artist. Not only has he created an art school, the Universal Constructive, but his work is the highest priced among Uruguayan artists in the world's most important art auctions.

Stop outside the Solis Theater for a photo opportunity. The Theatre, the greatest reference to all scenic arts in Uruguay, opened its doors for the first time the 25th of August 1856 and is strategically located in the historical and cultural area. The tour continues to the Prado area for a visit to the Blanes Museum, a beautiful 19th Century mansion, home to the impressive oil paintings of Juan Manuel Blanes internationally renowned Uruguayan Artist as well as Pedro Figari, Rafael Barradas and others.

Continue your drive to the Visual Arts Museum, the most comprehensive collection of Uruguayan artists since 1850. Their purpose is to treasure, with strict selective criteria, national and foreign works of art, to catalogue and conserve them, in order to illustrate exhaustively the history of national art, emphasizing everything that refers to national art.

Notes: Tour timing might vary slightly (+/- 15 min) depending on traffic. Timing also could be affected by Holidays and/or unforeseen circumstances. As this excursion involves extensive stair climbing at the museums, which have no elevators, it is not recommended for guests with walking difficulties. It is recommended that guests wear flat, comfortable shoes. Alternative optional visits: Museums may be changed by a similar alternative, in the event of closing due to strike, repair or traffic problems in the day of the visit.

Type: Highlights

Depart from port for a city orientation tour, visiting the main points of Montevideo. From the pier drive to Independence Square where the mausoleum and Artigas Monument stand in honor of the Uruguayan national hero. Then travel along 18 Julio Avenue, the city's stately main commercial thoroughfare, with direction to the Legislative Palace, the Parliament building where Congress and Senate meets.

Continue the tour to Parque Batlle neighborhood, passing by the Obelisk and the Soccer Stadium for a photo stop at La Carreta Monument (Covered Wagon).

Then, head to the theatre where the best and legendary murga 'Falta y resto' will be waiting for you to live for a while the experience of being a murgista (murga performer).

Montevideo it's the city where the longest and more participative musical comedy festival in the world takes place, the Uruguayan Carnival. During 40 nights, theatre companies offer their performance on popular stages all over the city

Color, glitter, fun, nonchalance, good humor, laughter and emotion are the main component of this Uruguayan celebration of life. Now we give you the possibility to live the essence of the Murga phenomenon, where a colorfully made-up face becomes a short cut to happiness.

Are you ready to enjoy a moment of joy, tenderness and hope? Come up to the murga! Try on a murga costume, sin chorus on stage and have fun! The best Uruquayan murga is waiting for you!

HALF DAY Explore like a local

Enjoy the city as if you were a local – go local and visit the different markets, explore by your own. On this opportunity you will be able to taste local snacks and a refreshment, as well as a typical Uruguayan drink.

Depart pier and make your first stop at: MAM – Montevideo's former Agricultural market. This market was built between 1905 and 1915, located in an area which led to several roads that connected most part of the city. During the first decades of the 19th century, this was where most products that supplied Montevideo could be found. Nowadays, this sample of one of Montevideo's best architectural works, offers a wide variety of products and services such as: handcrafts, spices, gluten-free products, local pastries, fruits, veggies, meats, restaurants and other.

Continue your drive towards Cordon neighborhood and make your next stop at: Mercado Ferrando. Getting hold of the best Uruguayan craft beers at a good price, enjoying a hot chocolate with churros on a communal table where you can interact with other diners, having an iced tea or tasting origin coffee, picking your own fruit which you will take home later, are some of the alternatives that can be experienced at Mercado Ferrando. In the past years this area has had a strong take-off and has seen the birth of countless gastronomic ventures and night pubs that lure university students but also people in their 30s, 40s and "even more" who look for stylish surroundings where they can dine peacefully and taste new flavors.

Your third stop will be at "La Rambla", one of the most attractive and characteristic open spaces in the city, daily visited to take walks or practice sports. Approx 30' at leisure to walk around this promenade, go down to the beach or take some pictures. Along the Rambla you will see the typical Uruguayan image, which is people walking with their "Mate" in hand.

HALF DAY

Montevideo highlights drive & walk

This is a complete tour of Montevideo's monuments, parks and gardens. From the port, you will proceed through the city's old quarter to Independence Square where the mausoleum and Artigas Monument stand in honor of the Uruguayan national hero. Facing the Independence square is the Government House (Presidents Museum) and the Solis Theatre. Walk up to Constitution Square, which is flanked by the majestic Cathedral and the Cabildo, or Town Hall.

Re-board your coach and continue your drive along 18 de Julio Avenue, the city's stately main commercial thoroughfare. Beyond lies the Congress Building, an imposing multi-colored marble structure. A photo stop will take place at the Legislative Palace, the Parliament building were Congress and Senate meets. This impressive building is the pride of Uruguay and was constructed between 1908 and 1925 with 52 kinds of local marble and 12 types of wood.

Continue to Batlle & Ordoñez Park, passing by the Obelisk, La Carreta monument (Covered Wagon) and the Soccer Stadium, continuing to the residential area of Carrasco. There will be a stop at Plaza Virgilio, where there is a monument dedicated to Fallen Navy Soldiers, and from which an excellent view of the city will offer a great photo opportunity. Drive will return to the port along the coast of marvelous beaches that Montevideo has right at its doorstep.

Notes: The order of sights visited may change to avoid and alleviate congestions at destination. Timing might vary slightly (+/- 15 min.) depending on traffic. Timing also could be affected by Holidays and/or unforeseen circumstances. It is recommended that guests wear flat, comfortable shoes. Walking involved: Moderate.

A HISTORY OF LIFE AND WINES: Luigi Spinoglio, a history connected with vines and wine. He had his origins in Casale de Monferrato -Piamonte, Italy, where he learned from his uncle the job and to develop a passion for it. That job and passion was the only inheritance he took with him when he immigrated to Uruguay and left Italy behind. His son John went on with the legacy but died very young so it was his grandson Angel, who being only 17 years old took up the reins and expands the business. In the 60s Angel and his wife Blanca bought the present wine cellar and surrounding land located in the Cuchilla Pereyra, Montevideo and it is now their son Diego who is fully committed to the maximum standards of quality with the same passion and respect for this LANDS of WINES.

Depart towards Spinoglio Winery located in the southern region of "Cuchilla Pereyra" at only 25 km Northwards of Montevideo for a workshop to design your own blend between TANNAT & MERLOT strains, hand in hand with the winemaker.

Enjoy the experience with the wine created and compare it with wines from the cellar together with a selection of cheeses, assorted cold meats, olives, nuts, bread.
